June 5, 2010

72 Hour Forecast: No Oil Expected in Gulf Breeze; Santa Rosa Island / Pensacola Beach - tarballs are still coming ashore

- Gulf Breeze spill response team employees are walking the public beaches around the city every day in the early morning, late evening, and 3-4 hours after high tide in search of tar balls and other oily substances.
