## **RESOLUTION NO. 02-11**

**WHEREAS**, Santa Rosa County and its jurisdiction have experienced severe damage from flooding on several occasions in the past, resulting in property loss, loss of life, economic hardship, and threats to public health and safety, natural resources and the local economy; and

**WHEREAS**, Santa Rosa County received a Flood Mitigation Assistance Planning Grant for the purposes of developing a Multi-Jurisdictional Flood Mitigation Plan and committed to providing the required 25% local match utilizing in-kind staff time in development of the plan; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Santa Rosa County Multi-Jurisdictional Flood Mitigation Plan (hereinafter “the Flood Plan”) has been developed through the efforts of the Santa Rosa County local Mitigation Strategy Task Force, specifically the Flood Mitigation Plan Task Force, which consists of employees and community members of Santa Rosa County and the City of Milton, City of Gulf Breeze, and Town of Jay as well as other representatives from various state agencies and non-profit organizations; and

**WHEREAS**, this is a multi-jurisdictional plan where all cities and townships were invited to participate in the planning process and cities will be invited to adopt the Flood Plan, and,

**WHEREAS**, this Flood Plan, as an addendum to the Santa Rosa County Local Mitigation Strategy Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan, will better address present and future flood planning; and

**WHEREAS**, this Flood Plan will serve as the Flood Mitigation Plan required of all communities participating in the National Flood Insurance Program and seeking project funding from the Flood Mitigation Assistance Program; and,

**WHEREAS**, the planning process included public involvement and coordination with key stakeholders in the county, and several public meetings were held to review the Flood Plan during the planning process; and

**WHEREAS**, the Flood Plan has identified and described the flooding hazard and has assessed countywide vulnerability and risk in the flooding hazard; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Flood Plan recommends hazard mitigation measures that may protect the people and property potentially affected by flooding hazards in Santa Rosa County; and,

**RE:** Replacement and Reroute of Florida Avenue Lift Station Force Main

The Florida Avenue lift station is a major wastewater lift station for the City system as it services a large portion of the system. It is also the final point at which wastewater is pumped to its final destination at the WWTP approximately seven (7) miles away.

The original portion of this force main is constructed of asbestos and cement or A/C pipe and is approx. fifty (50) years old.

We recently had two (2) failures in this section of pipe with no outside force involved. This indicates that the pipe cannot withstand the operating pressure of the system and other failures are likely. In addition when the force main is out of operation a large portion of the sewer system is impacted and other lift stations also have to be shut down.

To further complicate matters, the force main is routed thru a 10' easement between homes as illustrated in the attached drawing. The best option is to reroute the force main as shown and place it in the right-of-way instead of the easement.

A project of this magnitude will require engineering, D.E.P. permits in addition to the construction costs. The City's sewer 2011 budget for wastewater will be able to direct savings of \$22,000 by postponing the painting of the south WWTP Basin and staff anticipates savings from chemicals to fund the force main replacement.

Staff developed a scope of work and requested quotes from qualified contractors and received the following:

Based on the above, Staff recommends Warrington Utility and Excavation to replace the force main using the directional drill method at a cost of \$43,900.00

Staff has selected Ken Horne and Associates to provide engineering services to prepare permitting documents and coordination drawings as needed for this project. The attached quote of \$4,200 for engineering services is submitted for approval.

**RECOMMENDATION: City Council authorize Ken Horn and Associates to proceed with engineering and permitting in the amount of \$4,200 and authorize Warrington Utility and Excavation to perform the scope of work as listed for \$43,900 in order to replace the Florida Avenue Lift Station Force Main.**

1. Install 6" DR 11 HDPE force main with 12 gauge tracer wire from lift station site south to the south side of Florida Ave. then east to the east side of Bear Dr. then south to the south side of Shoreline Dr.  
(Diagram attached, contractor to verify footage).
2. Install 6"x 6"x 6" tee and two valve assembly as shown on south side of Shoreline Dr. at Bear Dr.
3. Connect to existing bypass tee and replace 6"x 4" reducer at lift station site.
4. Grout fill abandoned FM completely from new valve assembly to LS site (contractor to verify footage).
5. Pressure test according SSRUS Design Standards (100psi 1hr)

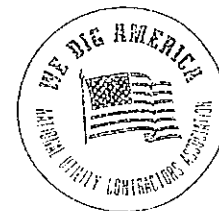
